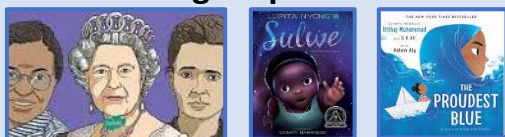

Science: Physics, studying seasonal changes.

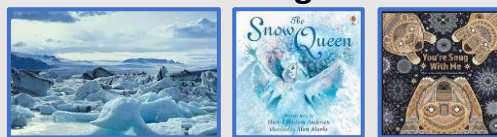
Art/DT: painting, inspired by Georgia O'Keefe; construction, making moving picture books.

Maths: arithmetic, measurement and mass.

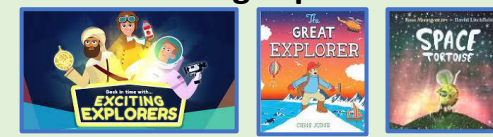
Science: Biology, studying plants.

Science: Chemistry, looking states of matter.

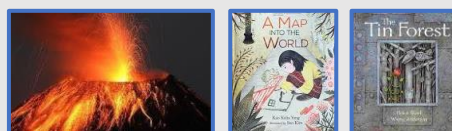
Art/DT: Drawing, inspired by Seurat; textiles, focusing on functional design.

Geography: Learning about the continent of Africa.

Maths: fractions, measurement and decimals.

Science: Physics, studying light.

Art/DT: painting, inspired by Kandinsky; construction, making pop-up books.

PE: developing tag-rugby skills further, along with swimming and gymnastics.

RE: studying Christianity and Judaism.

History: Learning about the Roman Empire and the world they created.

English: text types and genres based around the texts 'Escape from Pompeii' by Christina Balit and 'The Red Prince' by Charlie Roscoe.

Maths: shape, time and money.

Science: Physics, learning about magnetic forces.

Art/DT: drawing and painting, inspired by Banksy; textiles, making bags.

PE: developing athletics further and continue to work on cricket skills.

RE: learning about Sikhism, Judaism and Christianity.

'A Greek Odyssey'



History: Studying the times and ways of the Ancient Greeks.

English: text types and genres based around the texts 'Myths and Legends' by Antony Horowitz and 'Who Let the Gods Out' by Maz Evans.

Maths: working on place value, addition & subtraction, multiplication & division, perimeter and area.

Science: Biology, looking at living things and their habitats; and physics, looking at light.

Art/DT: Ceramics, inspired by Grayson Perry; textiles, focusing on fashion design.

PE: improving netball and hockey techniques further.

RE: learning about Christianity, Hinduism and Islam.

'American Adventure'



Geography: Learning about the Americas.

English: text types and genres based around the texts 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, and 'Ada's Violin' by Susan Hood.

Maths: developing fraction skills, fractions and decimals, algebra and statistics.

Science: Physics, learning about electricity.

Art/DT: painting, inspired by Frida Kahlo; construction, making moving toys.

PE: field games, including tag-rugby and football, along with gymnastics.

RE: studying Hinduism and Christianity.

'Keep Calm and Carry On'



History: Learning about World War 2 and the impact it had on the lives of people in Britain.

English: text types and genres based around the texts 'Once' by Morris Gleitzman and 'Rose Blanche' by Christophe Gallaz and Roberto Innocenti.

Maths: shape, position and direction and converting units.

Science: Biology, studying animals, including humans.

Art/DT: drawing, inspired by Henry Moore; food, making a menu based on rationing.

PE: developing strategies to improve athletic performance, and county dancing.

RE: discovering more about Hinduism, Christianity and Islam.
